

The Piast Institute receives grant from the Kosciuszko Foundation

The Kościuszko Foundation has given the Piast Institute: A National Institute for Polish and Polish-American Affairs located in Hamtramck, MI, a grant to provide partial support for the publication of the annual "Periphery." Dr. Thaddeus Radzilowski, president of the Piast Institute, has been the publisher of "Periphery" for six years. The editor is Dr. Tadeusz Witkowski of Ann Arbor, Michigan. "Periphery" is widely regarded as one of the best journals of Polish affairs published in English. In addition to original artwork, it contains poetry, scholarly articles, opinion pieces, fiction and reviews. Its past contributors include Czesław Miłosz, Adam Zagajewski, Stanisław Barańczak, Zbigniew Brzeziński, Leszek Balcerowicz and Wisława Szymborska. The next issue of "Periphery" will be published in early 2005.
