Homecoming this weekend

The East Detroit High School and Roseville High School homecoming parades are Oct. 14.

The Roseville parade begins at 10 a.m., from the Roseville City Hall parking lot, at Common and Gratiot. The parade will commence from the parking lot, proceed down Common, turn onto Normal Street and into the high school parking lot.

The Roseville football game begins at 1 p.m. The crowning ceremony is set for half-time, which school officials estimate about 2 p.m. RHS is located at 17855 Common Road.

The East Detroit High School parade is at 11 a.m. Jim and Carol Havrilla will serve as grand marshals. Route details were not available at press time, but in past years,

the parade traveled from Couzens, to Linwood, to Nine Mile, to Hayes, to Stephens, to Flower, to Memorial Field.

The EDHS float theme is board games so the parade is "Roll the dice, make your move and race to the finish." EDHS is located at Nine Mile and Gratiot. Memorial Field is located on 10 Mile Road.

The Piast Institute: A National Institute of Polish and Polish American Affairs was chosen as a Census Information Center by the U.S. Bureau of the Census Oct. 6, according to a press release issued by Lampar Consulting in Sterling Heights.

According to the press release, U.S. Sen. Debbie Stabenow, D-Mich., was scheduled to make the announcement last Friday, before the *Eastsider* went to press, at a press conference at Macomb Community

College's new Cultural Center in Clinton Township. According to the press release, Macomb County's population is approximately 20 percent Polish American.

As a CIC, the Piast Institute will develop and disseminate information on the Polish American community to print and electronic media, public officials, governmental agencies, non-governmental organizations, and Polish community leaders, fraternal and societies. A secondary goal of the Piast Institute CIC will be to serve the needs of other local immigrant groups and those who provide services to them.

The CIC program was established by the Census Bureau to make census data available to diverse communities across the United States.
